Everyone Likes to be Recognized

Everyone likes to be recognized! Recognition by peers can be an important motivator to members and volunteers. Recognizing companies and other organizations that support IEEE activities let's them know that you appreciate their support and encourages future support. Recognizing IEEE organizational units encourages the volunteers involved to further efforts.

Member recognition includes helping your peers achieve senior membership or going from associate member to full member. Many folks who are associate members qualify for full IEEE membership and thus the right to hold elected positions and participate in IEEE elections. Changing a member from an associate to a full member is an easy operation for a section officer and recognizes that they are a full member of the IEEE. The process of elevating a member to a senior member is a bit more involved than the associate member elevation. A senior member nomination can be made by the senior member candidate, or one of the three senior member or fellow references that must help a candidate with their senior member nomination. If one of the three references submits the nomination form then the other two references only need to fill in the reference (note that the membership numbers of the senior member candidate as well as the three references is needed to submit a nomination).

This is the method often taken at local IEEE senior member elevation events where a group of senior members helps regular members submit their senior member nomination form and references. Region 6 wants to have more senior members elevated during 2016 than it ever has before as part of our 1% total membership growth plan for the region so we hope that your local section will have one or more of these events this year. It is important to recognize companies and individuals that have helped at the section, area and region level through the Region 6 awards program. We have just finished the 2016 awards program at the section and area level and are moving on to the region awards.
